LEA GOAL: Continue to utilize technology to improve the instructional practices in all curricular areas: Through professional development and with guidance from our technology director, technology will continue to assist in all areas of instruction. This will include professional development training in Google applications.

SCHOOL GOAL: #1 To provide professional development opportunities for teachers, administrators and paraprofessionals in the areas of Technology, Common Core State Standards, Next Generation Science Standards, Strategies for improving instruction for students, Student emotional needs awareness

### What were the findings from the analysis of this data?

The findings indicated that we have a great need for training in technology since we are implementing 1 to 1 devices this year; they also indicated that there is a need to further understand some of the strategies that have been successful with students who have suffered trauma in their lives. The findings indicate that we need training on the front end of the NGSS and that we continue to need professional development in CCSS.

### What data did you use to form this goal?

- We gathered data regarding accessibility of technology for each of our students at home.
- We researched the most appropriate device for our needs.
- We researched web filters and what type of access we were going to allow students.
- We researched a Digital Citizenship curriculum to be delivered to our students.

# What were the findings from the analysis of this data?

We found that most students had access to the Internet at home, however, not all access was wireless.

With the help of our District Technology Director, we found the most affordable, durable, and advanced Chromebook to purchase.

We found that the web filter issues were going to be complicated and consulted other districts for help with our web filters.

We found several programs promote Digital Citizenship but we wanted to find one with parental support built in.

# How will the school evaluate the progress of this goal?

We will measure success of 1 to 1 device deployment with furnishing 100% of our students with Chromebooks.
